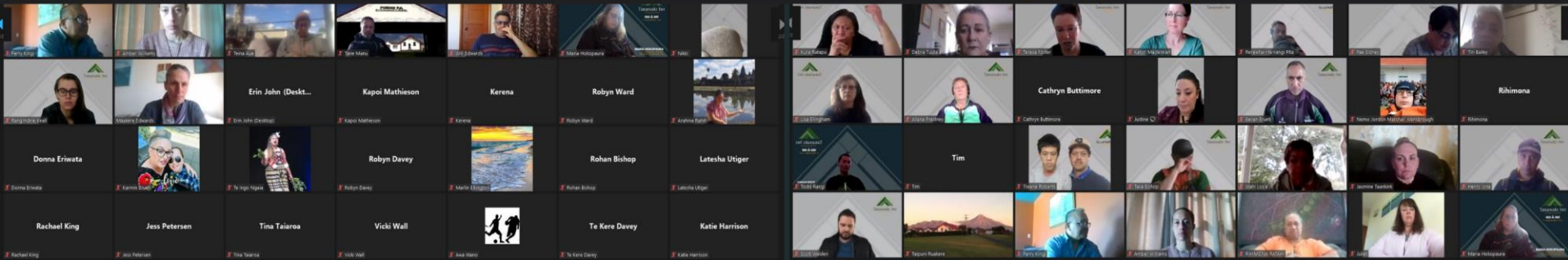

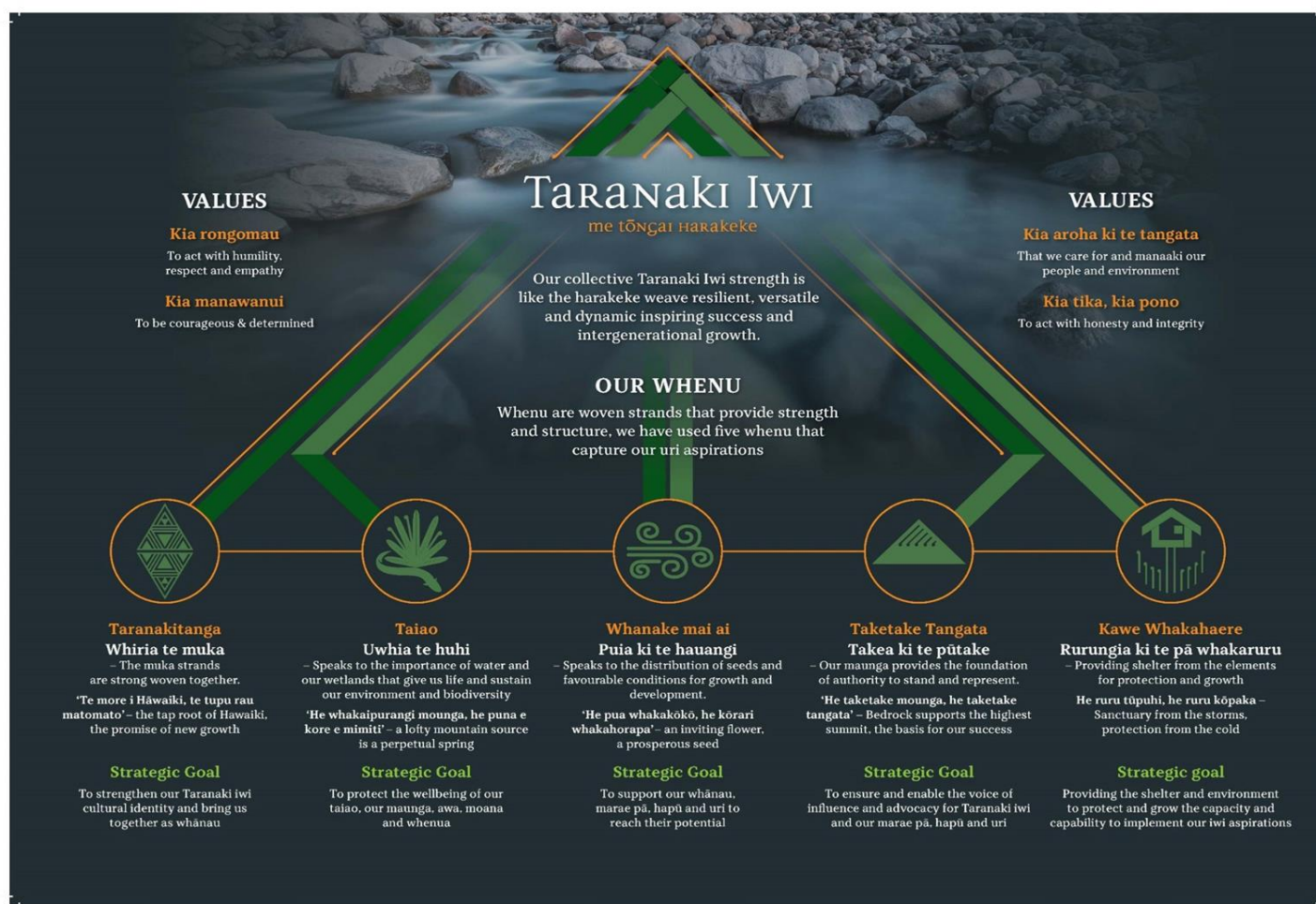

# MAUNGA NEGOTIATIONS



- Negotiations paused before the election - met with Minister Little before Easter 2021 to discuss outstanding matters
- Outstanding matters:
  - Resourcing of arrangements
  - Park name: Te-Papa-Kura-o-Taranaki use of National Park
  - Role of Te Tōpuni Kōkōrangī (TTK) in the development of the Conservation Management Strategy (CMS)
  - Governance: the mechanism for the establishment of Te Tōpuni Ngārahu (the collective post-agreement governance entity);
  - Asset-holding: the proposal that assets can be held by Te Tōpuni Ngārahu in the name of Te Kāhui Tupua; and
  - Tax treatment: the tax status of Te Kāhui Tupua and of Te Kōkōrangī Ngārahu when holding assets on behalf of Te Kāhui Tupua.
- In the event that Minister is able to meet expectation on resourcing likely to have a Deed finalised for initialling in August/September 2021

## Legal Person and Values

### Te Kahui Tupua (legal person)

- Establishment of legal person
- National park land and certain minerals vested
- Interim custodian of Taonga Tūturu
- Power to hold assets (Te Tōpuni Ngarahu govern/manage)

### Maunga Values and Status statement

- Ngā Mātāpono Tupua (Maunga Values)
- Status statement: “indivisible and living whole from the peaks through to the surrounding lands”
- Sit alongside the principles in the NPA as purposes for the management of the national park

## National Park

### Renamed Te Papa-Kura-o-Taranaki

#### Management Plan

- Sets management objectives for the national park
- Development and consultation process consistent with NPA
- Developed by Te Tōpuni Kōkōrangī (replaces the role of the Conservation Board)
- Co-drafting (DOC and Te Tōpuni Ngarahu)
- Approved by MOC and Te Tōpuni Ngarahu
- Review of plan and advice from NZCA

#### Operational management

- DOC retains operational management and concessions decision making roles (see interests in land concessions)
- Enhanced processes for involving NIOT
- Annual discussion with the D-G and Te Tōpuni Kōkōrangī on operational management priorities
- Concessions income retained in the national park

## Governance Arrangements

For the legal person, national park and for iwi

### Te Tōpuni Kōkōrangī (Joint Governance Entity)

- Voice of the legal person, advocacy
- Replaces Conservation Board for the Park
- 50:50 Crown/Iwi appointees

#### Functions:

- Develop National Park Management Plan
- Monitor operations and National Park Management Plan
- Involvement in Crown Minerals processes (if any)
- Developing asset holding policy for Te Tōpuni Ngarahu
- Land related functions under NPA, including joint decision making with MOC over interests in land concessions
- Input into Conservation Management Strategy Park Place
- Relationship documents with DOC and MOC, form relationships with other key stakeholders (NZCA, Conservation Board, local and central government)
- Authorise use of the name “Te Kahui Tupua”
- Secretariat support provided by DOC
- Exemption from certain liabilities
- Governance and management of legal person’s assets under the asset holding policy
- Cultural minerals fossicking (within park, as per cultural materials plan)
- Relationship document (DOC)
- Access to facilities (within park)
- Cultural materials plan (within park)

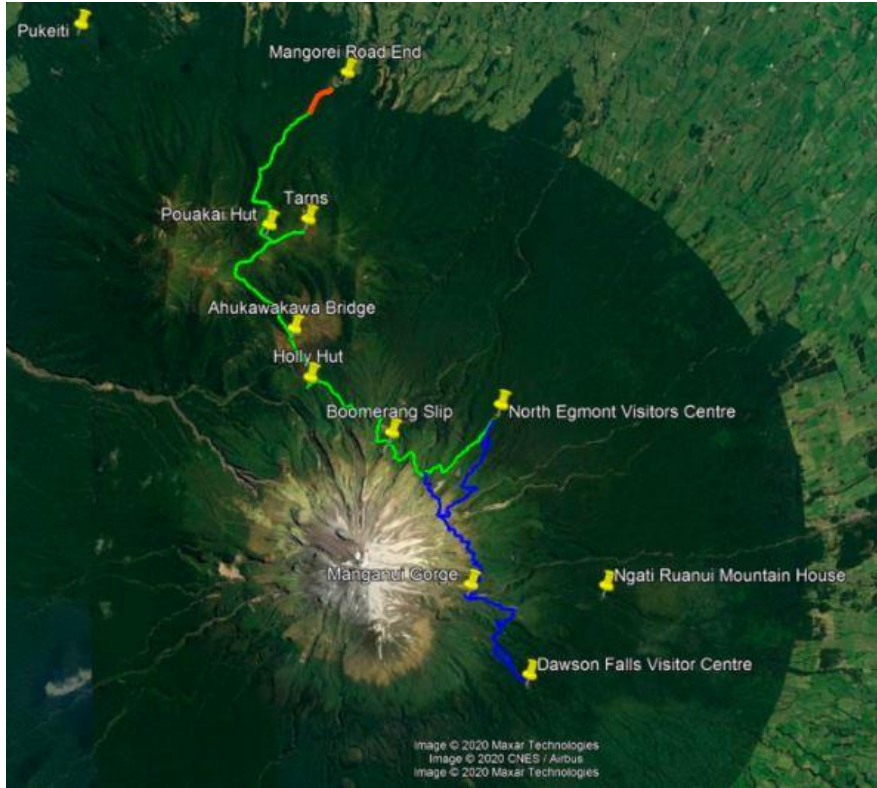

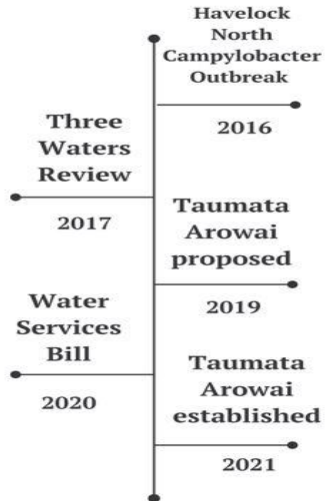
Disestablishment Update



**Following legal advice from Kāhui Legal & recent meet with Te Puni Kōkiri (TPK) Officials TMTB has determined:**

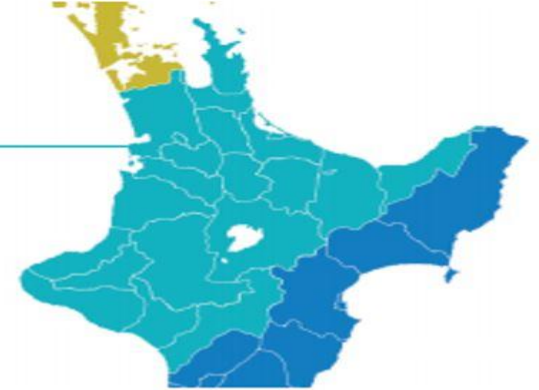
- Taranaki Māori Trust Board Annuity to be distributed amongst the (8) Post Settlement Governance Entities

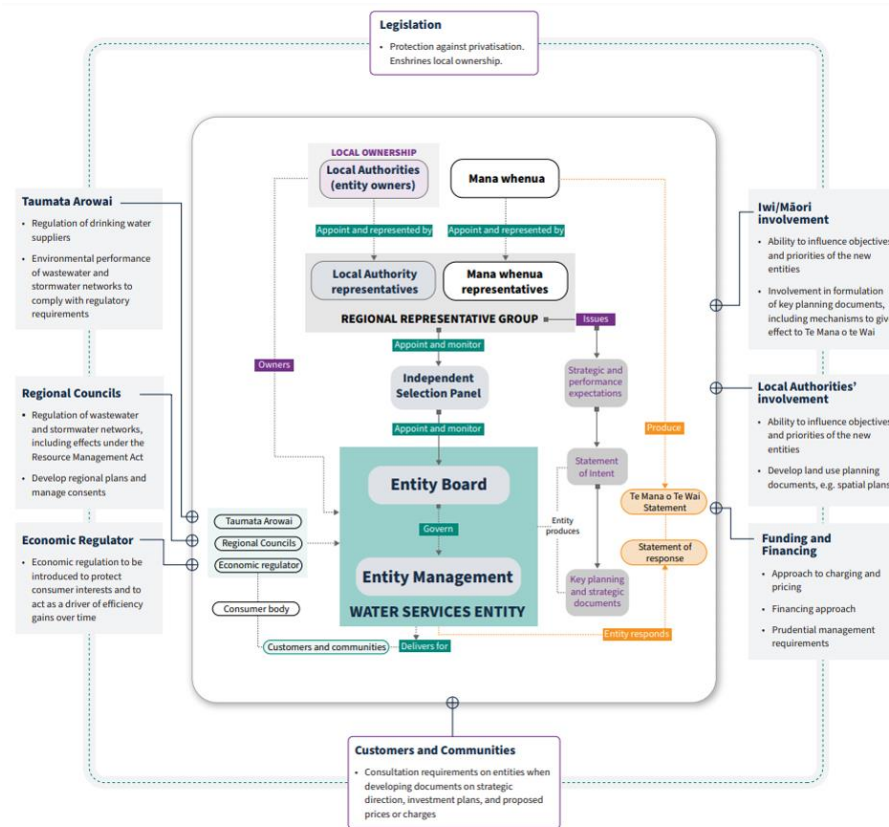

# MĀORI HEALTH AUTHORITY

- The Māori Health Authority Transition Unit team is headed up by Chad Paraone, Maara Andrews and Bernard Te Paa
- Significant work is being undertaken in the policy space to support the legislative framework for the establishment of the Health Reforms
- In spite of the effect of COVID Lockdown, this legislation is expected to be passed and to come into force by 1 July 2022
- Partnership Boards will be enshrined within the legislation
- Appointments to the interim boards for Health NZ and the Māori Health Authority are expected to be announced mid September

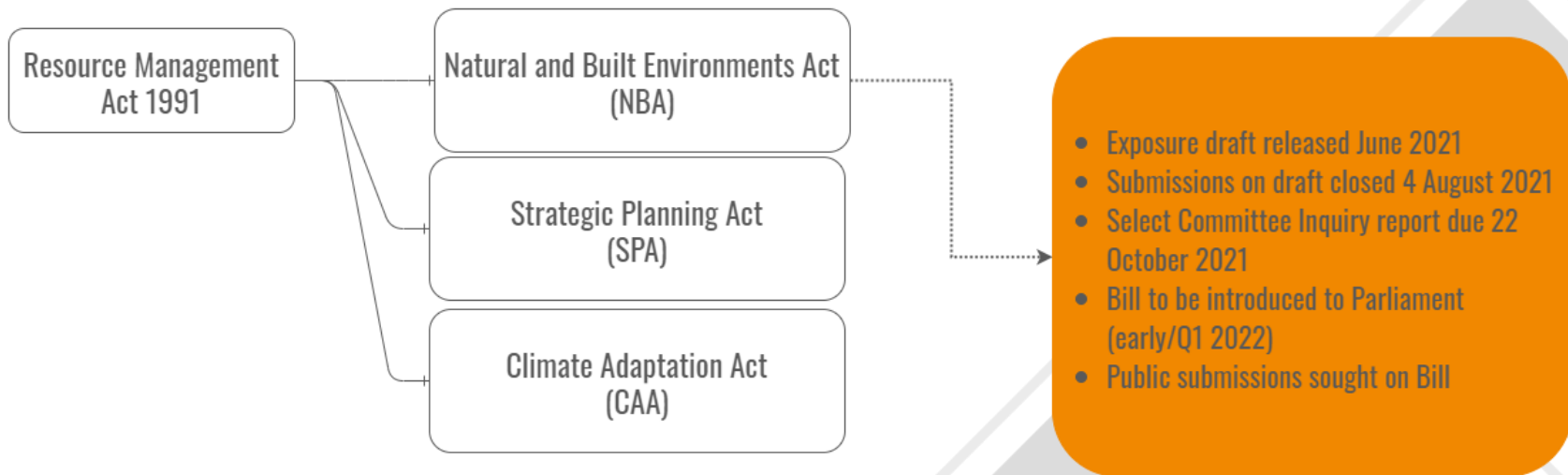

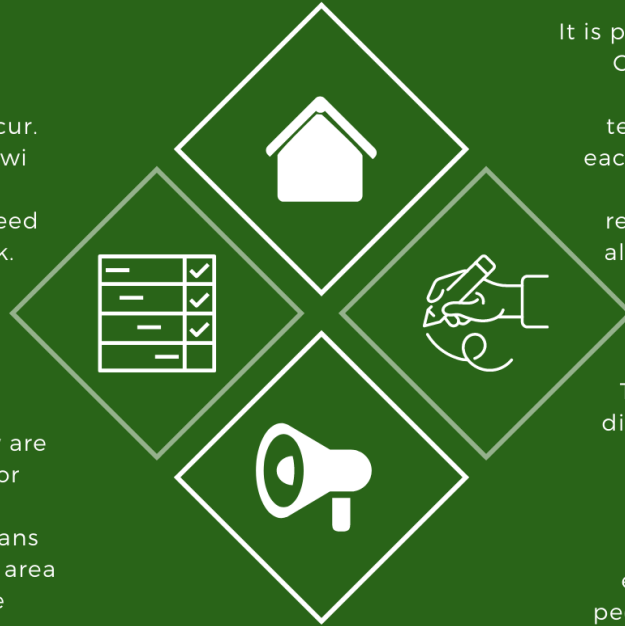
# Testing Governance in the RM Reform for the NBA and SPA

## GOVERNANCE; DECIDING ON PLANS

Each of the 14 regions will require representation of Iwi and Hapu. We have advocated for 50% and the Minister has stated this will NOT occur. We will need to have collectives of Iwi appointing representatives to the decision making committees. We need to test with you how this could work.

## THE PLANNING FRAMEWORK

We are keenly focused on the framework that determines the purpose of the plans, and how they are delivered, this will set the whāriki for the content of the plans. These frameworks will be used to draft plans by the 'Secretariat'. This is a crucial area to ensure the implementation of Te Oranga o te Taiao and other overarching clauses.



## SECRETARIAT

It is proposed 'secretariats' independent of Councils, write the plans based on the planning framework. We will require teams of Iwi Māori technicians to be in each of the 14 secretariats to ensure that the views of the iwi and hapu are represented in the drafting, this area is also crucial to getting better plans and Taiao outcomes.

## ENGAGEMENT

Throughout the NBA and SPA process, direct engagement is required between the secretariat and our iwi, hapu and landowners. All phases will require significant resourcing and implementation support. The engagement provides the views of our people to be integrated into the plans.

# Governance Expectations for the New Resource Management System



- Arrangements that:
- Give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi;
- Give effect to our Te Aō Māori view (including upholding both Te Oranga o te Taiao and Te Mana o te Wai);
- Protect and support the mana motuhake of hapū and iwi in their respective rohe;
- Address iwi/hapū rights and interests;
- Require at least 50% hapū and iwi representation and require the chair to be appointed by the hapū and iwi of that respective rohe;
- Enable the 'boundaries' of governance areas to be defined by the hapū and iwi of those respective rohe;
- Require any hapū and iwi representatives to be appointed and accountable to their hapū and iwi collectives, not the Crown;
- Be fully resourced by Local Authorities/Crown and include a secretariat;
- Ensure that any national matters are to be defined by hapū and iwi and the decision making on these matters are shared with hapū and iwi;
- Ensure a National Body does not usurp the mana of hapū and iwi their respective rohe.
