MAUNGA NEGOTIATIONS



- Negotiations paused before the election met with Minister Little before Easter 2021 to discuss outstanding matters
- Outstanding matters:
 - Resourcing of arrangements
 - Park name: Te-Papa-Kura-o-Taranaki use of National Park
 - Role of Te Topuni Kokorangi (TTK) in the development of the Conservation Management Strategy (CMS)
 - Governance: the mechanism for the establishment of Te Topuni Ngarahu (the collective post-agreement governance entity);
 - Asset-holding: the proposal that assets can be held by Te Topuni Ngarahu in the name of Te Kahui Tupua; and
 - Tax treatment: the tax status of Te Kāhui Tupua and of Te Kōkōrangi Ngārahu when holding assets on behalf of Te Kāhui Tupua.
- In the event that Minister is able to meet expectation on resourcing likely to have a Deed finalised for initialling in August/September 2021

Legal Person and Values




Following legal advice from Kāhui Legal & recent meet with Te Puni Kōkiri (TPK) Officials TMTB has determined:



MĀORI HEALTH AUTHORITY

- The Māori Health Authority Transition Unit team is headed up by Chad Paraone, Maara Andrews and Bernard Te Paa
- Significant work is being undertaken in the policy space to support the legislative framework for the establishment of the Health Reforms
- In spite of the effect of COVID Lockdown, this legislation is expected to be passed and to come into force by 1 July 2022
- Partnership Boards will be enshrined within the legislation
- Appointments to the interim boards for Health NZ and the Māori Health Authority are expected to be announced mid September



GOVERNANCE; DECIDING ON PLANS

Each of the 14 regions will require representation of Iwi and Hapu. We have advocated for 50% and the Minister has stated this will NOT occur. We will need to have collectives of Iwi appointing representatives to the decision making committees. We need to test with you how this could work.

THE PLANNING FRAMEWORK

We are keenly focused on the framework that determines the purpose of the plans, and how they are delivered, this will set the whāriki for the content of the plans. These frameworks will be used to draft plans by the 'Secretariat'. This is a crucial area to ensure the implementation of Te Oranga o te Taiao and other overarching clauses.

SECRETARIAT

Taran

It is proposed 'secretariats' independent of Councils, write the plans based on the planning framework. We will require teams of Iwi Māori technicians to be in each of the 14 secretariats to ensure that the views of the iwi and hapu are represented in the drafting, this area is also crucial to getting better plans and Taiao outcomes.

ENGAGEMENT

Throughout the NBA and SPA process, direct engagement is required between the secretariat and our iwi, hapu and landowners. All phases will require significant resourcing and implementation support. The engagement provides the views of our people to be integrated into the plans.

Governance Expectations for the New Resource Management System



- Arrangements that:
- Give effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi;
- Give effect to our Te Aō Māori view (including upholding both Te Oranga o te Taiao and Te Mana o te Wai);
- Protect and support the mana motuhake of hapū and iwi in their respective rohe;
- Address iwi/hapū rights and interests;
- Require at least 50% hapū and iwi representation and require the chair to be appointed by the hapū and iwi of that respective rohe;
- Enable the 'boundaries' of governance areas to be defined by the hapū and iwi of those respective rohe;
- Require any hapū and iwi representatives to be appointed and accountable to their hapū and iwi collectives, not the Crown;
- Be fully resourced by Local Authorities/Crown and include a secretariat;
- Ensure that any national matters are to be defined by hapū and iwi and the decision making on these matters are shared with hapū and iwi;
- Ensure a National Body does not usurp the mana of hapū and iwi their respective rohe.

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


On 15 March 2021 Te Kāhui o Taranaki formed a partnership with Ministry of Business, Innovation & Employment (MBIE) to:
